
## American Airlines Flight 11

## **American Airlines Flight 77**




## **Air France Flight 447**

The crash of Lion Air Flight 610 was a major turning point in the history of aviation safety. In the wake of the crash, the FAA implemented new regulations to improve safety of the Boeing 737 MAX aircraft.
