
The Assassination Plot Against President Garfield: Medical Fiascoes that Changed the Course of History

- Failing to remove the bullet near his spine. The bullet was lodged dangerously close to Garfield's spinal cord, and doctors were afraid to remove it for fear of causing paralysis. However, this decision left the wound open to infection.
- Using unsterile instruments. The doctors who treated Garfield did not use sterile instruments, which allowed bacteria to enter the wound and cause infection.


